Re: Complaint of Judicial Misconduct

Dear Mr. White:

We have received your email dated December 16, 2024, intended for Chief Judge Murguia. To submit a complaint, please ensure it complies with the requirements set forth in the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings (JC&D Rules) and the Ninth Circuit Local Misconduct Rules.

Your complaint of judicial misconduct must comply with JC&D Rule 6(d), which states that "[t]he complainant must provide a contact address and sign the complaint. The truth of the statements made in the complaint must be verified in writing under penalty of perjury."

Your complaint of judicial misconduct also must comply with Ninth Circuit Local Misconduct Rule 6.1(d), which requires the following written acknowledgment: "I understand that even if I successfully prove that the judge engaged in misconduct or is disabled, this procedure cannot change the outcome of the underlying case." You may either type or write this acknowledgment in the space provided in Section 6 of the enclosed complaint form or on the first page of the complaint.

Lastly, your complaint of judicial misconduct must comply with Rule 6(b) a concise statement that details the specific facts on which the claim of misconduct or disability is based. The statement of facts should include a description of: (1) what happened; (2) when and where the relevant events happened; (3) any

information that would help an investigator check the facts; and (4) for an allegation of disability, any additional facts regarding that allegation.

Enclosed, you will find a copy of the Misconduct Rules and the Ninth Circuit complaint form. But if these requirements are not completed, the complaint will be returned to you with a request for correction. Please note that your judicial misconduct complaint is addressed to the Office of the Circuit Executive.
